

This May marks the 99th anniversary of <u>Children's Book Week</u>; the theme for this year's celebration is "One World, Many Stories."

Voting for the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual <u>Children's & Teen Choice Book Awards</u>, the *only* national book award voted on *solely* by kids & teens, has been in progress since March 1, and many locations will hold group voting in the class, store, or library until May 6, when voting ends.

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# MAKE A MODEL LIGHTHOUSE

Cut a rectangle this size out of clear plastic.

An empty water bottle is perfect. Use a permanent marker to draw the lantern room windows.

Roll into a cylinder and wrap with clear tape to secure. Glue in place at the top of the lighthouse.

Curout this lighthouse shape.

Cut out this pie shape to make the lantern dome. Bring the straight edges together, overlap and glue to form a cone.

Attach this to the lantern room. Hot glue is best.

Ask a grown up for help!

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
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Fold out tabs.
