

TIME TO READ!



BEFORE WE READ LET'S LOOK AT...

The Cover: Read the title. Ask students to look closely at the picture on the cover and make observations about it.

The Pictures: Look through the pictures in the book. What are some of the emotions that are represented in the pictures? **Content Specific Vocabulary:** refugee, relief worker, resettle

Purpose for Reading: Say to students, "As we read, think about how the sandals help the characters develop a friendship."

WHILE WE READ

MONITORING FOR COMPREHENSION

- Where are the characters living in this story?
- How did the two girls each get one sandal from the pair?
- Why do the girls need to figure out a way to share the sandals?
- What is the solution for sharing one pair of sandals between two girls?
- What list does Lina's family appear on at the camp?
- Why are Lina and Feroza a little bit happy and a little bit sad at the same time?
- Why do the girls go back to having one sandal each at the end?



LET'S THINK ABOUT

Our Purpose: How can compassion and empathy foster friendship? Ask students to think about the challenges faced by Lina and Feroza and how working together formed their friendship.

Extending Our Thinking: How can empathy help people make deep and lasting connections? Ask students to consider how knowing and

understanding their friends, family, and community members brings everyone closer.
