TIME TO READ!

Before reading: Ask kids what they usually do on a normal school day. What happens from morning until night? Are children's activities the same around the world? Read to find out how we may all be different but are still very much the same.

RELATED ACTIVITIES

A DAY IN THE LIFE (AGES 4-12)

- 1. Give each child a different time of day (example: before school) or daily activity (example: eating breakfast).
- 2. Let them bring in a photograph or draw a picture showing that part of their normal routine. Arrange all the pictures in order from morning to night.
- 3. Display them on a wall or bulletin board to show a day in the life of your group!

GLOBAL HOPSCOTCH (AGES 5-12)

Different types of hopscotch are played around the world. Try some of these (pictured right) or make up your own version.


Burmese (Myanma) children play hopscotch squatting with hands on hips.


